It has felt busy in school over the last weeks. All the children are working hard and enjoying some amazing celebrations of achievement in our Celebration Worships on Fridays. In Owl Class the children have been working hard looking at solving number sequence problems and in Kingfisher Class the children have been racing cars to help in the recognition of ordinal numbers! Skylark Class have amazed me with the speed of their maths fluency in the mornings and their excited buzz around improving their scores from previous lessons in TT Rockstars and 99-Club. Ospreys have been tackling factors, prime factors and factor trees this week, an incredible amount of maths skills in one week.

Our parent consultations are on Tuesday and Wednesday (9th and 10th October). I hope you have managed to find time to come and chat with your children's teacher about their progress and achievement.

- Platinum badge when the children receive 500 house points, and
