

Maths

Throughout all our maths work we will continue to use a variety of appropriate mathematical vocabulary in context. AT the beginning of this term we will be focusing on multiplication and division. Towards the end of the term we will measure, compare, add and subtract: lengths (m/cm/mm) and then move onto measuring the perimeter of simple 2-D shapes

A homework task will reinforce our learning either by completing a sheet or using My Maths. We will continue to use TT Rock stars each week and as homework tasks. The children will also continue to work on their appropriate club within the 99 club.

PSHE

Our topic is 'Dreams and Goals'

Through this unit the children will share their hopes and dreams, they will begin to understand that sometimes not all hopes and dreams will all come true. The children will think about how to work out the steps to take to achieve a goal..

English

This term we are covering elements of SPaG on a daily basis through our 'Basic Skills focus', paying particular attention to punctuation, conjunctions, and words from the year 3 & 4 spelling list. We will begin the term looking at Stories from other Cultures, focusing on The Butterfly Lion by Michael Morpurgo, as our class text. The final outcome of this unit of work will be character descriptions. The latter unit of work will be on non-chronological reports, which will link to our Geography unit of work on the UK. Weekly spellings will continue to be given and will be linked to the rule for that week.

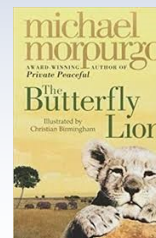
Science

Geography

In this unit the children will be taught to name and locate counties and cities of the United Kingdom. They will identify human and physical features such as hills, mountains, coasts and rivers. The pupils will use maps, atlases and digital mapping to locate and describe features studied.

Music
