As mentioned in a previous newsletter, please ensure that your children have water bottles in school with them each day. It is important that the children rehydrate during the day as this has been shown to have a positive impact on their learning. Clubs Mr McCarthy will be continuing his after school clubs next term, KS1 fundamentals on Mondays and KS2 Netball on Tuesdays. It is a privilege to be part of these clubs, respectful and responsible behaviour is expected from all the children who are lucky enough to be part of them. Children will be sent into school if poor behaviour choices are made and Mr McCarthy feels the other children's learning is being negatively impacted. Parents will be informed of poor behaviour choices and if children are sent into school three times, parents will be informed and the club place will be removed. Please help us to support your children in making positive behaviour choices in our after school clubs.

It was lovely to see the support the school has from its parents as the church filled up- the children brimmed with excitement at showing parents some of their Harvest Work.
