SCHOOL UNIFORM

We have made some small changes to the school uniform for September 2018 see below: Grey or Black Trousers, Skirt, Shorts or Pinafore Dress White Polo Shirt (no logo required) Black School Shoes (no trainers or boots) Plain grey or white socks or tights Light Blue and White Gingham Dresses for girls in summer Navy Blue School Sweatshirt or Cardigan with logo (available from Brigade)

P.E. KIT

Black shorts and plain coloured house t-shirt (Willow - Royal Blue, Oak - Yellow, Sycamore - Red, Birch - Emerald Green, black plimsolls and trainers. The t-shirts will be available to order from Brigade from Monday 2nd July to ensure that we do not have different shades of the colours we would request that the PE t-shirts are ordered from Brigade and not bought elsewhere. They are very reasonably priced at £4.50 each, plain black (strictly no stripes or logos) tracksuit or jogging bottoms and sweatshirt for winter (these can also be purchased from Brigade)
