At Great Wishford CE Primary School, we believe that good attendance is vital for children to achieve well. It is very important that children attend school every day to make the progress in their learning, which they are capable of.

All the research tells us that children with high attendance figures from a very young age achieve better at GCSEs than those who have low attendance figures. A child's attitude to learning and to school is set whilst they are young and they need to recognise how important it is to attend school every day throughout primary school.

We aspire as a school to achieve 96% or above attendance across the school and we monitor and review the attendance of all pupil's carefully. If a child falls below 90% or becomes close to the 90% figure, we are required by the LEA to make parents aware of this information, which will be done so by sending a letter home each term advising that we as a school are monitoring attendance or inviting you in to a school attendance meeting.

Recently, we sent home letters regarding attendance so far this year, following our termly meeting with the Education Welfare Officer. Some of you will have received a letter and thank you to those who have been into school to discuss their child's attendance. Following some feedback from a few parents Mrs Bale (Chair of Academy Council), Mr Porter (Executive Head), and myself (Headteacher) have decided to look at the wording from the EWO recommendations for future letters.

Regular school attendance plays an important part in helping your child grow up to become a reliable and responsible person. There are now clear links between regular school attendance and children's attainment in later life.

Each year there are 190 school days, which leaves 175 days for holidays, shopping, birthday treats and non-urgent medical and dental appointments.
